#### INTRODUCTION

Information literacy has never been more important than ever, yet resources and support for the programs and people who are best-suited to teach and facilitate information literacy has dwindled in too many schools across the globe. School Libraries seeks to empower librarians, classroom teachers, school and district leaders, policy makers, parents, and communities by arming them with the most powerful research-based frameworks, recommendations, and support for school library programs.

# **EDUCATION SYSTEM IN DUBAI**

The Knowledge and Human Development Authority (KHDA) under the Ministry of Education (MoE) is the responsible body for the school education in Dubai. The schools are two types of Schools in Dubai known as Public Schools where in the primary and secondary education to the citizens of UAE at free of cost. The medium of instruction is Arabic and the English is taught as the second language. The other type of schools are known as Private schools with

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number of different curricula to cater the educational needs of the expatriates in the country. There are more than 186 different nationals are enrolled in the private schools.

## **REVIEW OF LITERATURE**

Olatokun (2008) investigated the use and pattern of use of the Internet among secondary school students in Ibadan, a Nigerian municipality. Findings revealed that majority of the respondents use Internet for leisure rather than for educational purposes, though some respondents affirmed that reading habits and academic performances have been improved by Internet use. Sin (2012) found that school information environment, frequency of school library use, race/ethnicity, and home computer availability were the top three factors affecting public library usage for schoolwork, leisure, and Internet access. More importantly, library service levels had a positive impact on students' library usage in terms of frequency of use. The study of Omotayo (2006) revealed a high percentage use of the Internet. The access point for them is cyber cafes. The university library though linked to the Internet is yet to provide access to students. The study also revealed that their use of the Internet has not affected their use of the library. Some problems they faced in the use of Internet include slowness of the server and payment for the access time.

- 1. To find out the qualification level of the Librarians of the participating schools.
- 2. To know about the collection level of the participating school libraries.
- 3. To examine the IT facilities in the participating school Libraries.

## **METHODOLOGY**



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


